ASSAULT

Castle Ridge Court, 8/9, 1:57 p.m. Deputy D.J. Ferrell responded to an assault. The victim advised he and his roommate got into a disagreement over rent. During the disagreement, the suspect assaulted the victim with a knife. The victim was treated for his minor lacerations as deputies detained the 33-year-old suspect. He was charged with malicious wounding and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

BREAKING AND ENTERING

Primary and Urgent Care, 231 Garrisonville Road, 8/9, 7:01 a.m. Deputy B.W. Gildea responded to a business alarm. While no one was located inside the building when deputies searched it, there was evidence someone was there, but not to see a doctor. Using business cameras, it was discovered a male suspect unlawfully entered the business at approximately 3:47 a.m.

DRUGS

Rappahannock Regional Jail, 1745 Richmond Highway, 8/10, 11:21 a.m. Sergeant K.P. Lytle responded to drugs being discovered. Jail staff advised they located a suspected controlled substance in an inmate's possession. The suspected controlled substance was seized.

DUI

The caller advised a driver was traveling 15 MPH under the speed limit and swerving off the roadway. Deputy Martin located the suspect vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. The driver had signs of intoxication and admitted to consuming "a little bit" before she got behind the wheel. She was charged with driving under the influence and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

LARCENY

a handgun ran up to the residence and stole the package. The package was discovered to contain cell phones. The suspect would flee in a white vehicle.

He caught staff's attention due to his big and puffy jacket, considering the enjoyably warm temperatures. After watching the suspect further, they observed him concealing \$150 worth of items on his person. During a search incident to arrest, Deputy Baldi discovered he was carrying a concealed knife. The suspect was charged with shoplifting and carrying a concealed weapon. He was released by the magistrate on personal recognizance.

Walmart, 11 Village Parkway, 8/10, 3:31 p.m. Deputy A. De Hoyos responded to a larceny. Staff advised they observed a male suspect skip scanning over \$170 worth of items. The suspect received a summons for shoplifting and was released.
