PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Both suspects, under the age of 21, had signs of intoxication and containers of alcoholic beverages. Suspect one had a false identification out of Ohio. They're plan to hang around the area until they sobered up changed when they were brought to Rappahannock Regional Jail. Both were charged with public intoxication and underage possession of alcohol. Suspect one was additionally charged with providing a false identity to law enforcement and possession of a fake driver's license. Both were held until sober.
