ASSAULT

Colonial Forge High School, 550 Courthouse Road, 8/16, 7:25 a.m. Deputy G.M. Lum was conducting his SRO duties when he was informed of an assault. One student assaulted another first thing in the morning. When the victim's friends attempted to stop the assaulting student, she would assault them as well. Four criminal complaints for assault and battery were filed.

DUI

Forbes Street, 8/17, 12:33 a.m. Deputy A.E. Epps responded to a single vehicle auto accident. The caller advised a driver decided to plant his vehicle into some bushes. The prickly situation blossomed when the caller further advised the driver appeared intoxicated and was falling over himself. The driver had signs of intoxication and admitted to consuming roughly five beers prior to driving. While the driver requested if he could just walk it off and walk home, deputies insisted on giving him a free ride to Rappahannock Regional Jail. He was charged with driving under the influence and held until sober.

He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.
