DISTURBANCE

Clear Spring Lane, 8/25, 1:05 a.m. Deputies responded to a disturbance. An unsupervised party got out of hand and numerous people were fighting in the street. Deputies arrived and separated the parties. As a result, two females were charged with assault and battery by mob, one female was charged with assault and battery by mob and providing a false identity to law enforcement, one female was charged with disorderly conduct, one female was charged with public intoxication, and one male was charged with disorderly conduct and obstruction of justice.

DRUGS

Kings Highway, 8/25, 10:12 p.m. Sergeant B.U. Demirci and Deputy N.J. Amato responded to an unknown problem. The unknown problem was discovered to be a drug problem, for the suspect was "extremely high." The suspect would be found in possession of suspected controlled substances, and provided a false identity to deputies. After figuring out his secret identity, it was discovered the suspect had three outstanding warrants. He was served on those warrants and additionally charged with possession of controlled substances, as well as, providing a false identity to law enforcement. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.
