**DUI**

610 Mart and Tobacco, 395 Garrisonville Road, 7/21, 9:28 p.m. Sergeant A.T. Leckemby and Deputy S. Waheed responded to a drunk driver complaint. The caller advised he observed a male drive to the business in an intoxicated state and begin to urinate in the parking lot. When deputies arrived, the suspect was fast asleep behind the wheel cuddling a bottle of Grey Goose. After his nap, deputies observed signs of intoxication. The suspect would also advise "yeah I am intoxicated" and demanded to know what deputies would do about it. That question was answered when he was put into handcuffs. He was charged with driving under the influence, driving without a license, refusal, and indecent exposure. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

Abberly Drive, 7/22, 10:21 p.m. Deputy C.R. Newman responded to a suspicious vehicle. The caller advised a running vehicle had been in the area for an extended period of time. When Deputy Newman arrived, he observed the driver asleep behind the wheel with a bottle of Miller High Life in plain view. When the driver woke up, he had signs of intoxication. He was charged with driving under the influence and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

**LARCENY**

Stafford Nursery, 544 Truslow Road, 7/21, 7:20 p.m. Deputy C.A. Osborne responded to a charged-up larceny. A member of AAA replaced the battery of a vehicle for the suspect. When the conversation of payment came up, the suspect fled in his newly charged vehicle. Deputy Osborne was able to identify the suspect who advised he did not have the money "right now." Charges may be sought at a later date.

### **PUBLIC INTOXICATION**

Falmouth Post Office, 16 Linchfield Boulevard, 7/21, 9:33 a.m. Deputy S.C. Steinway responded to an intoxicated person call. Fire and Rescue staff advised they located an intoxicated male at the business. When Deputy Steinway arrived, he observed the intoxicated suspect shove his Four Loko beverages down a storm drain in an attempt to hide them. His sewer scheme was foiled. The suspect was charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

Lakewood Drive, 7/21, 7:29 p.m. Sergeant A.T. Leckemby responded to a simple request. A male suspect called dispatch and asked for deputies to “come get him.” Sergeant Leckemby would locate the suspect in an intoxicated state. He knew he was intoxicated due to numerous observed signs, as well as, the suspect stated that fact multiple times. The suspect requested to be arrested and Sergeant Leckemby did not refuse. The suspect was charged with public intoxication. Due to a pending adjudication in reference to a recent DUI case, the magistrate ordered him to be held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

Target, 25 South Gateway Drive, 7/22, 9:07 a.m. Deputy F.A. Martinez responded to an intoxicated person call. It was discovered a staff member was asked to leave due to his intoxicated state and instead began yelling at citizens in the parking lot. Deputy Martinez located the suspect who advised while he did not consume any alcohol, his ID “might” have some on it. He was charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.
