DISTURBANCE

Decatur Road, 7/2, 10:57 p.m. Deputies responded to a large party. Several residents called in regarding improperly parked vehicles blocking the roadway and the noise. The party, consisting of over 200 guests, took hours to clear up. Multiple vehicles were towed and the organizers were issued a summons for the noise ordinance.

DUI

Wawa, 920 Wonder Road, 7/2, 1:17 a.m. Deputy S. Waheed responded to a drunk driver complaint. The caller advised a van was traveling at a high rate of speed before the driver got out to urinate next to his vehicle. Deputy Waheed made contact with the driver, who labeled himself as a bread transporter. This bread bringer would be toast when deputies observed several signs of intoxication, as well as, an open four pack of red, red wine. That was the yeast of the problems when deputies discovered suspected controlled substances hidden in his sock. The driver was charged with driving under the influence second offense within ten years, and possession of controlled substances. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a \$2,000 secured bond.

FRAUD

C&F Bank, 175 Kings Highway, 7/2, 2:49 p.m. Deputy J.E. Cordes responded to a fraud. Bank staff advised a female suspect pretended to be someone else and attempted to withdraw a large amount of money from the victim's account. Suspicious of the suspect, staff requested additional information and when the suspect could not provide it, she fled. Contact was made with the victim who confirmed no one was allowed to access her funds.

LARCENY

Walmart, 11 Village Parkway, 7/2, 2:26 p.m. Deputy A.W. Sypolt responded to a larceny. Staff advised a repeat shoplifter was back at it, this time stealing nearly \$140 worth of items. Deputies located the suspect on Basalt Drive and discovered she was wanted out of Stafford County for a probation violation. She was served on her outstanding warrant and additionally charged with shoplifting. She was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

Holetzky was on the phone with a staff member regarding a different incident when that staff member informed him of a larceny currently taking place. Deputy Holetzky broadcasted the suspect vehicle to nearby units, resulting in Sergeant M.L. Jacobeen and Deputy M.A. Holub locating it on Mine Road. When they made contact with the suspect, he advised he wished to confess. After divulging his sins, he was issued a summons for shoplifting.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Hampton Inn, 2965 Richmond Highway, 7/2, 9:48 p.m. Deputy J.J. Holetzky responded to an intoxicated person call. The caller advised a male, who appeared intoxicated, was banging into walls and knocking on doors. Deputy Holetzky made contact with the clearly intoxicated suspect who advised he had "eleven" drinks. He was charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.
