ASSAULT

Wawa, 15 Eustace Road, 9/5, 8:04 p.m. Deputy C.A. Osborne responded to an assault. It was discovered the victim was driving in the area when the suspect hit his vehicle. The victim confronted the suspect on the hit and run in the Wawa parking lot when the suspect assaulted him. Warrants for hit and run, as well as, assault and battery were obtained but not yet served.

DUI

Intersection of Richmond Highway and Hospital Center Boulevard, 9/5, 7:38 a.m. Lieutenant R.J. Grella was traveling in the area when he observed a Nissan traveling in a less than acceptable way. Lieutenant Grella conducted a traffic stop as Deputy S.M. Craig responded to assist. The driver had signs of intoxication and admitted to consuming "a couple beers" before getting behind the wheel. He was charged with driving under the influence with a blood alcohol content between .15 and .2. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

It was advised a female had taken an unknown number of pills and was getting behind the wheel. She was charged with driving under the influence and fleeing from law enforcement. She was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

It was also discovered he possessed no driver's license. The driver was charged with driving under the influence, possession of controlled substances, drinking while

He was charged with driving under the influence and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a \$2,000 secured bond.
